### Welcome to Sedgemoor Manor School

At Sedgemoor Manor School, we deliver specialist educational, vocational, and therapeutic and care services for young people aged 7 to 19 years, with a diagnosis of autism and associated complex needs.

Our school is located in the peaceful and idyllic Somerset countryside, near the town of Highbridge. While we benefit from a beautiful rural location, the school has good transport links, being situated just five minutes' drive from the M5 motorway.

#### Personalised learning that transforms lives

Sedgemoor Manor School transforms the lives of young people by empowering them to break negative cycles and achieve their potential. With our specialist support, students build the confidence, resilience and independence skills to pursue their passions and aspirations, unlocking a range of exciting opportunities for their future. We are proud that young people leaving our school all move on to further learning or employment.

Our young people are at the heart of all that we do and we know that no two students with autism are the same: each young person has their own unique needs, strengths, preferences and ambitions. Students thrive at Sedgemoor Manor School because we are committed to delivering education and support that is carefully and skilfully tailored to them as an individual.

### Trusting and positive relationships

Ofsted has recognised the exceptional working relationships our staff build with students, which encourage them to love learning again. These positive connections make young people feel secure, valued and confident to be themselves at school, often for the first time. They learn in a warm and welcoming community, where they are listened to and understood.

As they undertake their learning journey with our school, we work in partnership with each young person, their families and the professionals that support them.







#### An idyllic location for learning

Sedgemoor Manor School is a converted manor house in one of the most picturesque areas of the country. Our extensive grounds provide opportunities for rewarding life experiences that broaden our students' horizons, including caring for animals, a forest school, gardening and horticulture.

### **Education services**

At Sedgemoor Manor School, we encourage young people to follow their passions and to avoid placing limitations on what they can achieve. We work holistically with each student, guiding them to develop socially and emotionally, and providing them with the tools and strategies to address the challenges that their autism can present. Our aim is that they achieve the academic qualifications for the next step of their life journey, while building the confidence and resilience to pursue their ambitions.

### A broad and balanced curriculum

Every child is unique and every student at Sedgemoor Manor School receives an entirely individualised package of learning and support, tailored to their individual needs, strengths and aspirations. We differ from mainstream schools in that we do not expect our students to fit into what already exists. Highly specialised teachers, therapists and support staff work together closely to create a seamless, integrated approach for each young person. Students are also assigned a learning mentor to support their personal development and reengagement with learning.

Many of our students have had bad experiences at mainstream schools and time out of education. They often arrive at Sedgemoor Manor School lacking in confidence and disengaged from learning. We carefully transition young people into the school with learning that enables them to experience our 'culture of success', with stretching but attainable targets. As they settle into our school, learning becomes more challenging and structured.

Sedgemoor Manor School stands apart from other specialist schools by providing the same wide-ranging educational opportunities as many mainstream settings. Students follow a broad curriculum and study for qualifications, including GCSEs, AQA Unit Awards, Functional Skills, BTECs and Independence Awards via ASDAN. With our support, their learning journey enables every student to achieve accreditation.

We deliver a carefully planned, phased curriculum structure that provides both the challenge and support our children and young people need to succeed and progress. Pupils work in small groups with high staff to student ratios. This enables them to develop their social and emotional skills, and build friendships while receiving the help and care they need to progress academically.







# A nurturing environment that enhances wellbeing

When young people join our school, they enter a warm, supportive and welcoming learning environment where they soon feel secure, valued and understood. Staff build trusting relationships that make our students feel comfortable in school and ready to learn again.

We utilise the Thrive Approach to support our students' wellbeing and developing resilience is embedded across the school and a number of our staff are practitioners. This approach provides the tools and training to support and measure students' emotional and social development, and means that our young people are better placed to engage with their learning and with life in general. Thrive draws on recent developments within neuroscience, attachment theory and child development to support how we can work with children to optimise their social and emotional development.

Our students learn to understand their emotions, to become more resilient, and to communicate and interact well with others. We equip them with the tools and strategies to address the difficulties that autism can present, and to maintain good mental health and wellbeing once they leave our school.



# A tranquil and specially adapted learning space

Our beautiful school is situated in a former manor house and has been specifically designed to meet the needs of children and young people with autism. Students learn in comfortable, low arousal spaces that are warm, inviting and purposefully non-institutional. Break out rooms provide safe and quiet places for young people, should they feel anxious or overwhelmed during the day.

The school is located in the stunning Somerset countryside, offering a peaceful, quiet and calming setting. Our extensive grounds provide opportunities to learn outside, the school's yurt acting as a base for enriching and rewarding activities which build life skills, including outdoor cooking, horticulture and animal care.

Many of our students particularly enjoy looking after our range of rescue animals and find this very calming if they are feeling anxious. A number have also gone on to achieve academic qualifications in animal care.

# Encouraging young people to discover their passion

Our school offers an enrichment curriculum, encouraging young people to experience the joy of discovering an interest or passion outside of their academic life. We want our children to be life-long learners, who are open to new experiences and enjoy developing new skills and knowledge.

By participating in a wide range of activities ranging from orienteering to horse-riding, archery to golf, our pupils develop new skills and talents, build confidence and improve their wellbeing. They also develop new friendship groups and a heightened sense of belonging to our school community.



### Preparing for a brighter future

Developing the social and emotional skills for independent living is a key objective from the very start of each student's learning journey at Sedgemoor Manor. Young people have opportunities to learn in the community so they acquire the confidence and everyday life skills they will need for the next stage of their journey. Work experience opportunities are provided on and off-site, and students receive careers guidance throughout their time with us. The school is affiliated to two local colleges, opening up a range of options for further learning.

### Working in partnership with parents

While our staff have the expertise to support young people with autism, we know that parents are always the experts on their child. We recognise that we must learn from each other, and work in partnership to fully meet each student's needs.

Communication with families is regular, open, two-way and led by the child's Tutor. We provide daily progress updates, as well as consulting on next steps in their education and care. In addition, there are opportunities to meet staff face-to-face with an annual review, parents' evenings and an annual event celebrating students' achievements at the school. Staff also provide a range of training for parents to help them support their child at home.

Our school is supported by a central team including an Operations Director, Health and Safety Advisor and Quality Lead, ensuring a consistent and robust approach of the highest standards.


### Therapeutic support

Every pupil at Sedgemoor Manor School receives a personalised package of therapy that helps them to address their barriers to learning and prepare to access our curriculum. Our therapy team work closely with teaching staff to ensure a cohesive, consistent approach to therapeutic support is taken across the school. As a result, students develop emotionally and socially, and gain valuable strategies for addressing the challenges that their autism can present.

Our therapy team identifies the issues that may be stopping a young person from learning, and then works with them to remove these barriers. They focus on helping students to manage their emotions and self-regulate. The entire school follows the Thrive Approach to

promote the positive mental health and wellbeing of our young people and some staff members

are now practitioners.





#### Wide-ranging therapy services

Young people have access to wide-ranging services including speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, mindfulness and reflexology. This is along with our use of lego, music, Thrive, animals, sports and arts to support with well being and self regulation. This provides students with a safe, calming and accepting space if they are feeling anxious, as well as building confidence and life skills. The school has dedicated therapy rooms, fully resourced to deliver high quality support to our young people.

Our therapists also work with families to help them support their child at home. This provides further opportunities to improve the wellbeing of our young people, and helps them to progress socially and emotionally.



### Leisure and residential activities outside of the classroom

The school accesses the local environment and utilises the school grounds as an educational resource. The school offers sporting and leisure activities including:
