

North Hill House School

North Hill House School is an independent specialist day and residential school for boys and girls aged 6 to 19 years with high functioning autistic spectrum disorders and associated needs. The school has been specifically designed to provide an education for young people who need different levels of support to succeed, thus allowing young people to thrive effectively in an ever demanding and complex society. Our aim is for students to live and work as self-reliant adults and we can support pupils to reach their goals with support, structure and guidance.

The school is set in its own grounds and is only a few minutes from the town centre. This offers opportunity for students to practise social and life skills in the town environment with the support and guidance of staff.

Case Study: Stephen's story

Stephen* came to North Hill House school in Year 8 with a diagnosis of ASD, ADHD, dyslexia and complex social needs.

Stephen required a highly personalised, multi-agency approach, including significant therapeutic intervention to be able to slowly build trust and to realise that he could thrive in a school for the first time in his life. After many school placements that ended prematurely, Stephen finally began to engage.

Stephen soon realised that the team at North Hill House School would help him through all of the challenges that were ahead of him. Their skills, experience and knowledge of the latest research would help him make progress beyond all expectations.

Stephen successfully completed his studies and left with a range of accreditations. He has now entered post 16 education, studying for a vocational qualification. Stephen has a bespoke support package that further enhances his social and independence skills in preparation for a successful and fulfilled adult life

Post-16

We have close links with Farleigh Further Education College, who operate nearby and offer specialist autism specific provision for those needing ongoing support. Pupils can access a range of educational and vocational courses at local mainstream colleges and specialist colleges.

100% of pupils requiring mental health or CAMHS accessed appropriate services


89% of young people with two or more incidents in the first term reduced their volume of incidents by the summer term
