Hurworth House School is an independent, specialist day school for boys and girls aged 5 to 19 years who have complex learning difficulties including social, emotional and mental health difficulties and autistic spectrum disorders (ASD). The young people may also have challenging behaviour as a result of their difficulties.

The school offers a warm and welcoming environment where a positive education allows all pupils to experience success. Our ethos was created in the belief that a positive, supportive and achieving culture is essential for pupil success. Pupils who come from a negative destructive and anti-achievement background need a completely different environment in which to rediscover success and self-belief.

Services offered

- Individually tailored programmes for education, social and personal development
- A positive environment to bring about positive change
- Continued and ongoing support with learning and life skills
- Strong links with local employers to provide an extensive work experience programme for pupils
- Opportunities to integrate into community life
- Intensive therapeutic programmes and strategies designed to assist with anxiety



Admissions criteria

- Aged between 5 and 19 years
- A diagnosis of significant social, emotional and mental health difficulties
- Associated complex needs
- A diagnosis of autistic spectrum disorder or evidence of behaviours which are in accordance with such a diagnosis
- An education, health and care plan

Safe and supportive environment

Hurworth House School is registered with Ofsted as an independent special school and is subject to inspection.

There are separate facilities for primary and secondary classes, which are housed within specialist facilities to meet the requirements of the National Curriculum including specialist areas for art, music, food studies, computing, mathematics and science.

Holistic approach

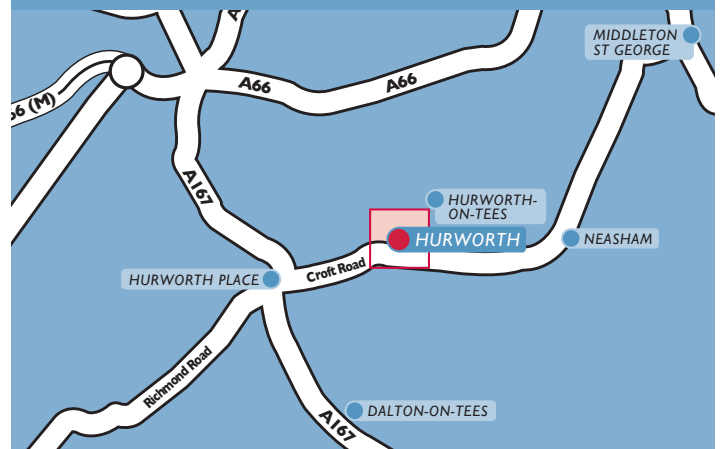
Our therapy programmes are overseen by trained clinical and therapeutic specialists including:
