We support young people aged 8-17 years with an autistic spectrum disorder (ASD) and childhood traumas.

Supporting the needs of the young people

At Chessington House, the dedicated and skilled staff team take a child-centred approach to care. We put the needs, interests and aspirations of each young person at the heart of all that we do and ensure they have a childhood that everyone deserves.

The children's home has a strong focus on building self-esteem, confidence, achieving positive outcomes and developing the skills required for young people to successfully transition to further independence and adult life.



Service summary

The range of services and facilities available at Chessington House includes:

- A safe and homely environment, within a quiet and rural location
- Accommodation comprising of 5 individual bedrooms, which the young people are encouraged to personalise
- A range of spacious facilities, including 2 lounges, a dining room, a family-style kitchen and an arts and crafts room
- Large gardens and fields beyond the property
- A well-qualified and experienced staff team
- Individualised care plans and a focus on developing daily living skills
- Strong links with local education provisions, including Priory's Sketchley School
- A wide range of planned on-site and community-based activities, subject to future relaxation of social distancing
